The month began with OLSH's participation in the Interact District-wide Christmas Cards for Veterans project, a tradition for our club. This initiative allowed students to express gratitude and holiday cheer to veterans who have served our country, a practice we've proudly upheld for several years.

This year, however, our Interact Club leaders wanted to expand our impact. For the first time, we participated in Wreaths Across America, raising \$300 to sponsor 16 wreaths that were laid on the graves of veterans at a local cemetery. Member Mariah Mars shared, "The Interact club is proud to help those in our community and honored to help those who served and protected our country through this event." Over 40 members of the Interact Club at Southmoreland High School stayed after school to hand-paint heartfelt Christmas cards for residents of local nursing homes, spreading


