

Criteria for Rotary Foundation Peace Fellowships:

The study of Peace and Conflict Resolution holds a special place within Rotary. In order to qualify for a Scholarship, a candidate must:

- 1) Must be from District 7305 (nine counties in Western Pa.) in order to receive our endorsement.
- 2) Plan to study outside the US at one of 5 Rotary Peace Centers:
 - A) Tokyo, Japan
 - B) Bradford, England
 - C) Queensland, Australia
 - D) Uppsala, Sweden
 - E) Chulalomykorn, Thailand
- 3) Proficiency in English
- 4) There are 2 different Programs:
 - A) Master's Degree, requiring a Bachelor's degree and 3 years working in a related field
 - B) Certificate, requiring 5 years of experience in a related field and a strong academic background
- 5) In order to gain our endorsement, Please have your application to the District Peace Scholarships Chairman by May 15th of the year studies are to begin. (i.e.-May for a September start).
- 6) You cannot be the son or daughter, brother or sister, grandson or granddaughter, niece or nephew of a Rotarian. (there are other relationship restrictions, as well).
